

Unity Garden currently has lots of different herbs, kale, edible amaranths, tomatoes, lots of flowers, carrots, and beans in the garden beds. Plus there is now one tiny baby pawpaw tree, 2 button bushes, ironweed, joe pye weed, indian grass, and New England Asters in the native plant area which is between the garden beds and the red fence.



The compost bin has been in continual use and seems to be doing rather well. Two metal benches have been assembled and extra sealed and

are in the process of becoming secure to the ground. One of the gardeners, Adolphine, for their volunteer time taught me how fast a sharp machete can cut up large invasive honeysuckle recently since she was very professional at knowing how to use this instrument. I am not as capable as her so I will stick to a saw and pruners during the work days.


