### Step Prayer

Several years ago, I started to explore new forms for prayer to focus and challenge my prayer writing and prayer life. I tried a number of traditional forms, but along the way, I hit upon a new form, something quite different from anything I had seen, a form I call "step prayer." A step prayer is a prayer that begins with a single word, a theme or thought and expands down seven levels by adding a word to each step ending with a seven word phrase for the last line. Each level is a phrase that reflects, echoes, relates to, or adds to the overall thought, theme or progress of the prayer. Feel free to try this. I think of the "rules" as fluid rather than fixed. Play with it creatively and see what you can create to spark your prayer life.

### Some examples:

Quiet
Surrounds me
And Your Presence.
Abide with me, Lord.
Open your way before me.
May Your Spirit fill me completely;
I am an empty vessel, awaiting You.

Praying
To You
Heart and soul
Opening now my life
To You who is life
Hear my prayer, grant me grace
Fill my life now in this place.

Mercy
O Lord
Is Your blessing
To those who confess.
So grant me the Grace
To live my life for You,
Guided by Your love, mercy and peace.


