Today we welcome Rev. Douglas Ensminger to our pulpit. Douglas was raised in India and educated at Princeton University and Chicago Divinity School. He was trained in Community Organizing at the Urban Training Center in Chicago, in Pastoral Counseling at the Chicago Institute of Pastoral Care and as a mediator at the Justice Center in Atlanta. He has ministered as a college chaplain, as pastor of churches in Wisconsin (Beloit and Madison) and Houston Texas. For 15 years he served as chaplain at the VA Medical Center in Houston, retiring as Chief of the Chaplain Service in 2010.

He and his wife Linda moved to Lexington to be close to their youngest daughter and her family, including 6 of their 10 grandchildren. Douglas has preached in many churches in KY, including two extensive periods in Prestonsburg and as Stated Supply in Nicholasville. Maxwell Street Presbyterian is their home church.

A gift to the Peace & Global Witness Offering enables the church to promote the Peace of Christ by addressing systems of conflict and injustice across the world. The Offering is divided among individual congregations to connect with the global witness of Christ's peace, mid councils for ministries of peace and reconciliation, and the Presbyterian Mission Agency for its ministry of education.
